

## TRANSPORTATION

### **By Subway**

There are five subway stops in the Financial District: Fulton Street, Wall Street, Whitehall Street, South Ferry, and Bowling Green. The **4** and **5** trains at Bowling Green, which is the last stop in Manhattan (going downtown) and the **W** and **R** trains (at Whitehall Street), are the nearest stops to 2 Broadway. The stations are located directly across the street from, and adjacent to, the Broadway side entrance.

Certain trains, listed below in bold typeface, always stop at the station, but those in normal typeface skip the station during certain hours. Consult the service schedule on a subway map to determine when those trains make the stop.

- 2, 3** to Wall Street (a 10 minute walk to the building)
- 1, 9** to South Ferry (a 5 minute walk to the building)
- R, W** to Whitehall Street (located at the corner to the building's main entrance)
- 4, 5** to Bowling Green (located across from the building's main entrance on Broadway)
- A, C, 2, 3, 4, 5** to Fulton Street (a 15 minute walk to the building)
- E** to World Trade Center (20 minute walk to the building)
- J, M, Z** to Broad Street (a 10 minute walk to the building)

From Grand Central Station: Take the **Downtown Express #4 or 5**. The ride to Bowling Green can be as short as 12 minutes and the stop is located across the street from the building's main entrance on Broadway.

From the Port Authority (West 42<sup>nd</sup> Street): Take the **Downtown Express A** train. This will bring you to the Fulton Street Station in as little as 17 minutes. At this point, you can also transfer to the **#4 or 5** and arrive at Bowling Green in 2 minutes.

From Penn Station (West 32<sup>nd</sup> Street): Take the **#1 or 9** train from Penn Station to South Ferry and walk 5 minutes to 2 Broadway.

### **By Bus**

**#15** bus travels south from 126<sup>th</sup> Street via Second Avenue and travels on Water Street after Fulton Street until it reaches South Ferry (a 5 minute walk to the building). It returns on the same route but travels north via First Avenue.

**#M6** bus travels to South Ferry (a 5 minute walk to the building) from Central Park South via Broadway and returns via Sixth Avenue.

**#X25** is an express bus that travels downtown from Grand Central Terminal during morning rush hours, which are from 7:15 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. Uptown afternoon rush hour service begins at 3:15 p.m. and ends at 6:30 p.m. Please note that the pick-up point for northbound service, Battery Place/Greenwich Street, is not the same as the drop-off point for southbound service.

#M9 bus travels to Battery Park City/Park Row from Union Square via East 14<sup>th</sup> Street, Avenue B, Essex Street and East Broadway.

#1 bus travels south from 147<sup>th</sup> street via Fifth Avenue and Broadway to South Ferry and returns via Park Avenue South, Madison Avenue and Lenox Avenue.

#Q32 bus travels from Northwest Queens to Lower Manhattan.

Each of the buses stops within a 5 minute walk of 2 Broadway. **For more information, contact MTA Transit Bus Information at (718) 330-1234.**

### **The Downtown Jitney Loop**

The Alliance for Downtown New York sponsors the Downtown Jitney, a shuttle bus service that provides free transportation throughout the Financial District.

During the weekday rush hours (from 6:45 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. and from 3:30 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.), four buses stop every 10 minutes along the route. During the off-peak hours (10:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. and from 7:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m.) two buses stop every 15 minutes along the same route, but they skip the South Street Seaport stop. The Jitney runs on Saturdays, Sunday, and holidays from 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., and buses stop every 25 minutes along the route.

### **Jitney Departures**

From the NY Waterway-Hoboken Ferry: The Jitney will depart from the bottom of Battery Park and bring you within 5 minutes walking distance of 2 Broadway in 10 minutes.

The return ride to either location takes only 10 minutes. Please note that for travel in either direction, you must tell the driver where you would like to stop.

### **By Car**

From New Jersey: Take the Lincoln Tunnel into Manhattan. Go west to Twelfth Avenue and then follow Twelfth Avenue south. It will turn into the West Side Highway, then the FDR Drive. Exit the FDR Drive at South Street. Go north until you turn right onto Broad Street. Follow Broad Street until you get to 80 Broad Street (alternate entrance located on Broad Street).

Or take the Holland Tunnel into Manhattan, go west to Twelfth Avenue and then follow Twelfth Avenue south. It will turn into the West Side Highway, then the FDR Drive. Exit the FDR Drive at South Street. Go north until you turn right onto Broad Street. Follow Broad Street until you get to 80 Broad Street (alternate entrance located on Broad Street).

From Long Island: Take the Queens Midtown Tunnel into Manhattan to the FDR Drive South. Exit the FDR Drive at South Street. Go north until you turn right onto Broad Street. Follow Broad Street until you get to 80 Broad Street (alternate entrance located on Broad Street).

From Westchester: Take the Saw Mill River Parkway into the Henry Hudson Parkway onto the West Side Highway. Exit at 59<sup>th</sup> Street and continue south on Twelfth Avenue. It will turn into the West Side Highway, then the FDR Drive. Exit the FDR Drive at South Street. Go north until you turn right onto Broad Street. Follow Broad Street until you get to 80 Broad Street (alternate entrance located on Broad Street).
